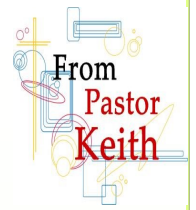

“Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?” He said to him, ‘You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’”

Matthew 22: 35-39



“I am convinced that love is the most durable power in the world. It is not an expression of impractical idealism, but of practical realism. Far from being the pious injunction of a Utopian dreamer, love is an absolute necessity for the survival of our civilization. To return hate for hate does nothing but intensify the existence of evil in the universe. Someone must have sense enough and morality enough to cut off the chain of hate and evil, and this can only be done through love.”

-Martin Luther King, Jr.

Love. We hear this word throughout the month of February. As Valentine’s Day approaches, the inside of grocery stores will be consumed with pink and red heart balloons, cards, and special heart shaped boxes of chocolates. Special flower bouquets will be up front and center, so there can be no excuses not to see them. As a nation, February is also the month we celebrate black history. While we all should celebrate black history throughout the year, it seems appropriate to unite by telling the story of how African Americans have been treated in our nation’s story, and to teach new generations their valuable impact on our country. Reflecting on the meaning of love, I chose two quotes that have deep spiritual value to me, one from Matthew, and the other from Martin Luther King Jr. In Matthew, Jesus is asked, “If you could pick one of the 613 commandments found in the Hebrew texts, which one do you think is a priority for how God wants us to live?” It’s funny how Jesus can’t pick just one. He says to love God with your whole being, and to love your neighbor as yourself. (Side Note: while we lift up the Ten Commandments, Moses continued to bring down other commandments to the people). There you go. Jesus makes it very clear what the faith is all about, love. As a good teacher, he not only preaches it but he lives it and gives us examples of what that looks like in the context of society.

MLK, a black southern Christian minister living during the Jim Crow era, speaks to the power of love in a world that can be filled with hate and evil. Martin knew what hate looked like. Hate threatened him and his family’s safety. Hate was shouted at him during his tour of the Northern states in the 60s. Hate needed to be transformed so that people who looked like him could live in safety. For MLK, love is what interrupts that which is hateful. Love “cuts off the chain of hate and evil.” He and so many other Civil Rights leaders and activists worked courageously to live love. As I preached on January 13, living a life of love can be unpopular and challenging. You may be criticized or ridiculed for standing up for your neighbor, but Hallelujah we worship a God that through Jesus shows us that love is the only way to bring about transformation.

Our world needs us to love. God needs us to love. We all need to be loved. When living the faith becomes difficult, never forget the words, these words of Jesus. Never forget these words of Martin Luther King. Most importantly, never forget that it is your God that loves you no matter what you have done or where you have been. You are loved.

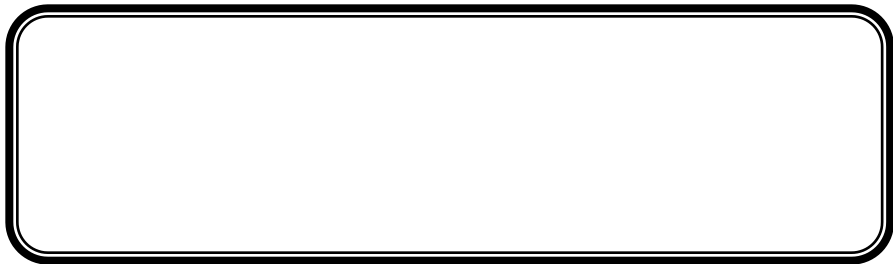
